

We have started reading the book 'The House with Chicken Legs' by our focus author Sophie Anderson.





Our English lessons this term are based on the book 'The Lost Words' by Robert Macfarlane and Jackie Morris. We are currently working on writing a poem based on an animal we might find in the Forest of Dean which includes kennings.

In maths we are finishing off our focus on multiplication and division which we started before Christmas. We will then go on to look at different types of measure including length and perimeter and mass and capacity as well as fractions and then decimals. As well as this, we are still working on learning all of our times tables to 12x12.

RE What is the 'Trinity' and why is it important to Christians?


Holly Berries Class


Class Reader - The author we are looking at this term is Oliver Jeffers. We have started reading some of the books he has written, including Up and Down. We are very excited to explore more books written by him.






Literacy - This term we are looking at the story The Koala Who Could by Rachel Bright. We have started by making predictions for the story and once read made a story map to learn the story in more detail.





Maths - Our first unit this term is looking at properties of 2D and 3D shapes. We are learning the different terminology related to the shapes. This week we have learnt about vertices and how to draw 2D shapes using a ruler

In History this term we will be learning how toys have changed. This week the children enjoyed sharing their own toys and exploring what materials they were made from. Over the next few weeks we will be looking at toys that their parents and grandparents may have played with and making comparisons between old and new toys.





In Computing we will be using different software to create music on the iPads. In our first lesson we listened to some pieces of music by the composer Gustav Holst. We discussed the similarities and differences and the feelings the music evoked.

School Census Day – Hot School Meals – Thursday 16th January 2025

Thursday 16th January 2025 is the national schools census day. School funding for the next financial year (April – March) is based on number of children registered at school on this day, also numbers who are on the SEND register, free school meals register and even those who eat a school meal on this day. So as to maximise the amount of funding we can receive we will hold a special meal on the Thursday and encourage everyone to try a hot school meal. Our menu is:

Spaghetti Bolognaise with garlic dough balls, or Chinese Vegetable Curry or Jacket Potato with Cheese

The weekly menu slips will reflect these changes. Please ensure menu slips are handed in during registration on a Monday morning. A hot meal costs £2.71 daily, (Pre-school £2.72 daily) and should be paid for in advance through our online payment system www.parentpay.com. Those children who are in Reception, Year 1 or Year 2 are entitled to a free meal under the Universal infant free school meal scheme, as are those entitled to free school meals.

Maple Class

Maple Class are continuing with our class reader, Goldfish Boy, but hope to move onto Friend or Foe by the end of term. Friend or Foe links in well with our current history unit 'What was the impact of World War Two on the people of Britain?'
