

DEAR YEAR 5 & 6 STUDENTS,

My name is Mrs. Mooney, and I am very proud to be the Headteacher of SGS Forest High School in Cinderford. I have lived in the Forest of Dean all of my life. My four sons and I have all been to school in the Forest, and therefore I am absolutely committed to the area providing an excellent education. I am writing to you because I know that at some point soon you have an important decision to make.



I have worked at SGS Forest High for the past two years, and in this time, we have made a lot of changes to our school. Earlier this year we were visited by a team of people who inspect schools called 'Ofsted'. They reported that we are 'good' in three out of the four areas, which means the school is the best it has ever been, but we are ambitious to make it even better.

You might have heard from people that our rules are a bit strict, and that we have high expectations. This is a good thing for children to help them to learn well. Our standards are higher than they were previously, which means it feels different for the older children at the school. They often tell us that the school is much better, and they are involved in shaping how we develop as we listen to their views through the school council and the student leadership team.
